Dulcarnon (dul kar' non). The horns of a DILEMMA (or syllogismum cornutum); at my wit's end; a puzzling question. From an Arabic word meaning "the possessor of two horns". The 47th proposition of the First Book of EUCLID is called the Dulcarnon (the theorem of PYTHA-GORAS), because the two squares which contain the right angle roughly represent horns.
